Our parenting journey started with becoming foster parents. We had the absolute honor and privilege of parenting three children over the course of more than two years. We went into foster care wanting to be a safe place for kids who needed it, and for however long they needed. For 15 months, we had a perfect little girl who we brought home from the NICU and raised. We were set to adopt her until, unexpectedly, her biological family came forward at the last moment.

We were devastated to say goodbye but can celebrate that she is happy, healthy, and loved. We truly have lived and experienced the saying, "Love makes a family."

We have also struggled to have biological children. We have had tests done, with no answers given. About two years ago, we suffered a devastating miscarriage after praying for years to get pregnant. While we hold onto God's promise for our family, we know starting our family through adoption is our next step.

Should you choose to make an adoption plan with us, we promise to always respect you. We promise that your child will always know how much you love them, and we will honor you in the highest regard. We promise that we will love your child like crazy, and not a day—even an hour—will go by that we don't tell them just how much we love them. We promise to keep you a part of the family with photos, meetings, letters, phone calls, whatever you are comfortable with. We promise we will raise them to love God and love others. We promise they will travel the world with us. We promise that our extended family will love them beyond measure, and probably spoil them, too!



WHYWE ARE ADOPTING

We have always had a heart for children and knew we wanted many kids! It has never mattered to us whether our child was biological, adopted, or fostered—our love is the same. God has made it clear to us that we will have multiple children in multiple ways, and we believe that He is telling us now to adopt our first child. While we have not had luck in biologically having a child, we are confident his is the path we are meant to be on. We firmly believe that adoption is the Gospel in action. As Christians, we are called to love our neighbors. There is no better way to love your neighbor than to welcome them into your family with an open heart and open arms (that includes you!) Our families have been an instrumental piece in our decision to adopt. They have diligently prayed for us and have each been given peace that adoption is the next step in our journey. We have had nothing but pure joy and excitement when sharing the news we are pursuing adoption.

Having been foster parents, we have seen the importance of having a relationship with biological family, and it is not something we take lightly.
