OUR STORY

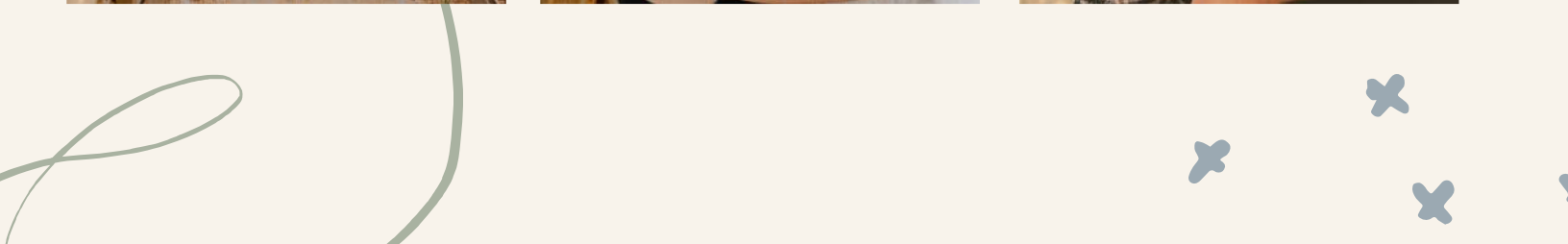
How We Met

Our daughter was a honeymoon baby and a wonderful surprise! We got pregnant again when she was 7 months old (another surprise) but soon after had a tragic loss. After 2 more devastating losses, we did not get pregnant again. The heartbreak of the miscarriages only worsened with the pain of suddenly and strangely not getting pregnant after it had been so easy for a while. We've seen doctors and learned nothing is wrong, making it more confusing. The hardship has brought us closer as a couple and shown us the intense love and value of family.

Adoption has always been in my heart (Hannah's). When I was 20, my aunt and uncle adopted their youngest daughter from China after years and years of waiting. It was an amazing experience getting to watch their entire journey from the beginning and see the fulfillment. My cousin is now 17! They have been a pillar in sharing their love and heart of adoption with us. Lifelong family friends adopted their youngest child, and my mom has 8 adopted cousins! We also have adult friends who have adopted and feel we have this beautiful community of support teaching us so much. I've learned so much about the pain and beauty and healing of adoption through watching so many stories of friends and family.

When we were dating, I brought my heart for adoption up with Robby because it was so important to me that he was on board with that. To Hannah's delight, I (Robby) was/am! I've always considered adoption to be an amazing ideal, and now I realize how it's not just an ideal but a passion to be present and available to provide for and raise an adopted child. OUR COMMUNITY



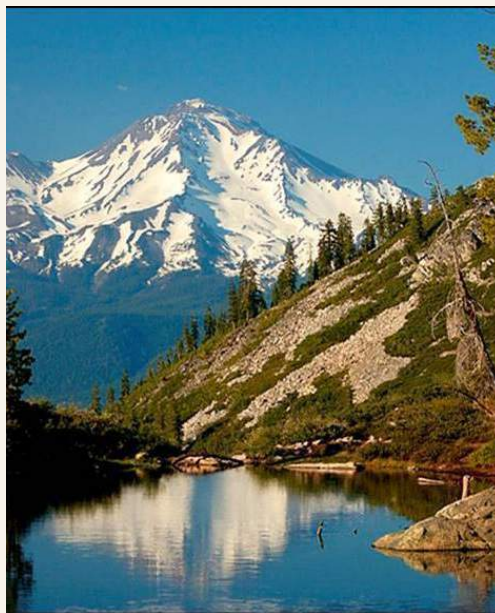

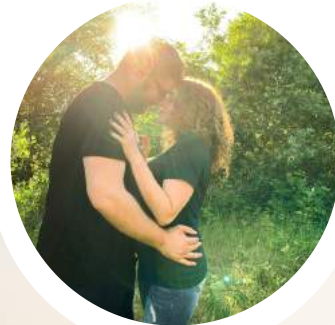
